



# ENGLISH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE (ESL)

### ESL 004 HIGH INTERMEDIATE ACADEMIC ENGLISH 4 unit

Transfer Credit: CSU; UC

Prerequisite(s): ESL 103 or ESL 122 or placement based on ESL assessment

High-intermediate integrated ESL course that prepares students to succeed in Advanced ESL and college courses by focusing on reading, writing, and grammar. No credit if taken after ESL 033A. Total of 72 hours lecture.

**Grade Mode:** Audit, Letter Grade, Pass/No-Pass

#### **ESL 005 ADVANCED ACADEMIC ENGLISH**

4 unit

Transfer Credit: CSU; UC

Prerequisite(s): ESL 033A or ESL 004 or placement based on ESL

assessment

Advanced level integrated skills ESL course focusing on reading, writing, research, and presentations that prepares students to succeed in college courses across disciplines. No credit if taken after ESL 033B. Total of 72 hours lecture.

Grade Mode: Audit, Letter Grade, Pass/No-Pass

#### **ESL 040 LITERATURE IN A SECOND LANGUAGE**

1 unit

Transfer Credit: CSU

Prerequisite(s): Enrollment in or completion of ESL 033A

Introduction to the diversity of fiction, poetry and drama in English and other languages. Designed for cultural expression and the development of reading skills in English. Total of 18 hours lecture.

**Grade Mode**: Audit, Letter Grade, Pass/No-Pass

#### **ESL 103 INTERMEDIATE ACADEMIC ENGLISH**

5 unit

Prerequisite(s): ESL 402 or ESL multiple measures placement

Integrated ESL course that prepares students to succeed in intermediate ESL and college courses by focusing on reading, writing, grammar, and speaking skills. Total of 90 hours lecture.

Grade Mode: Audit, Letter Grade, Pass/No-Pass

## ESL 106 SPEAKING AND LISTENING FOR ACADEMIC SUCCESS 4 unit

**Recommended Preparation:** ESL 136 or 146, and eligibility for ESL 033B or ENGL 100

Development of advanced speaking and listening skills for achieving academic goals. Task activities include group discussion, individual presentations, evaluation of lectures and media broadcasts. Attention will be given to building college-level skills. Total of 72 hours lecture.

Grade Mode: Audit, Letter Grade

#### **ESL 111 ACADEMIC READING FOR ESL**

3 unit

**Prerequisite(s):** One of the following: (1) Eligibility for ESL 033A; or (2) satisfactory reading placement assessment

Essential college reading skills and strategies with an emphasis on comprehension, academic vocabulary, and reading fluency. Focus on literal and interpretive levels of narrative and expository texts. Attention to the relationship between cultural references and textual meaning. Total of 54 hours lecture.

Grade Mode: Audit, Letter Grade, Pass/No-Pass

#### **ESL 113 ADVANCED ESL VOCABULARY**

2 unit

Prerequisite(s): Eligibility for ESL 033A or ENGL 100

Recommended for advanced ESL students needing to increase their academic vocabulary words and phrases in order to comprehend and use advanced academic English, increasing their confidence in comprehending and using high-level vocabulary for academic and non-academic situations. Focus on advanced prefixes, roots, suffixes; two-and three-word verbs, collocations/idioms, word families, and dictionary use. Total of 36 hours of lecture.

Grade Mode: Audit, Letter Grade, Pass/No-Pass

#### ESL 122 GRAMMAR AND WRITING - LEVEL 3

4 unit

Prerequisite(s): ESL 422, SPSV 490B or placement based on the ESL assessment process

Development of grammar and writing skills for academic purposes. Reading of low-intermediate fiction and non-fiction; written practice in sentence patterns and compositions. Recommended concurrent enrollment in ESL 432. No credit if taken after ESL 033A, 033B, ENGL 001A, 001B, 001C, or 100. Cannot enroll concurrently in ESL 033A, 033B, 420, 422, ENGL 001A, 001B, 001C, 100 or 400. Total of 90 hours lecture.

Grade Mode: Audit, Letter Grade, Pass/No-Pass

#### ESL 132 READING - LEVEL 3

3 unit

**Prerequisite(s)**: ESL 432 or placement based on the ESL reading assessment process

Development of word attack skills, vocabulary, study skills, and intermediate reading techniques. Recommended enrollment in ESL 122. No credit if taken after ENGL 415, 130, 014. Cannot be taken concurrently with ESL 460, ESL 432, ENGL 415, 130, 014. Total of 54 hours lecture and 18 hours laboratory. This course may be scheduled using the "To Be Arranged" (TBA) scheduling format.



## ESL 133 ADVANCED SENTENCE STRUCTURE REVIEW 2 unit

Recommended Preparation: Eligibility for ESL 033B, ENGL 100, ENGL 001A

Review of advanced grammar structures, including adverb, adjective, and noun clauses, and conditional forms. For ESL students who need to review advanced grammar. Total of 36 hours lecture.

Grade Mode: Audit, Letter Grade, Pass/No-Pass

#### **ESL 135 ADVANCED VOCABULARY**

2 unit

Recommended Preparation: ESL 003

Focus on advanced prefixes, roots, suffixes; two- and three-word verbs, collocations/idioms, word families, and dictionary use. For advanced ESL students needing to increase their academic vocabulary in order to comprehend and use advanced academic English, increasing their confidence in recognition and use of high-level vocabulary for academic and non-academic situations. Formerly ESL 113. Total of 36 hours of lecture.

Grade Mode: Audit, Letter Grade, Pass/No-Pass

# ESL 136 AMERICAN CULTURE THROUGH SPEAKING AND LISTENING 3 unit

Recommended Preparation: ESL 446 or 442, and enrollment in ESL 033A or ENGL 415

Development of high intermediate to advanced speaking and listening skills through the discussion of current events and American cultural and social issues. Movies, song, TV and radio programs will be used to enhance cultural competency and to build fluency in aural comprehension and spoken communication skills. Activities include oral reports, group and panel discussions, in-class and out-of-class interviews. Some library research and reading assignments. Total of 54 hours lecture.

Grade Mode: Audit, Letter Grade, Pass/No-Pass

#### **ESL 144 HIGH-INTERMEDIATE PRONUNCIATION**

3 unit

Recommended Preparation: Completion of ESL 441 (or its equivalent)

Further development of pronunciation skills through practice of American English. Use of International Phonetic Alphabet to aid with pronunciation of new vocabulary. Total of 54 hours lecture. Formerly ESL 146.

**Grade Mode**: Audit, Letter Grade, Pass/No-Pass

## ESL 146 PRONUNCIATION OF AMERICAN ENGLISH – LEVEL 2 3 unit

Recommended Preparation: Completion of ESL 246 (Level 1) or its equivalent, current enrollment in ESL 106 or eligibility for ESL 033A

Further development of pronunciation skills through practice of American consonant blends and advanced stress and intonation patterns. Use of phonetic alphabet reduced forms and advanced features of vowel and consonant sounds. Total of 54 hours lecture.

Grade Mode: Audit, Letter Grade, Pass/No-Pass

### ESL 150A COMMUNICATION SKILLS FOR HEALTH SCIENCES

2 unit

Communicating with efficiency and professionalism. Construction of both formal and informal conversations, including questions, using various verb tenses and aspects of word forms; use correct pronunciation, stress, and intonation in the workplace with colleagues and patients. For students desiring to work in a medical office or as a healthcare professional. Total of 36 hours lecture.

**Grade Mode:** Letter Grade, Pass/No-Pass

#### **ESL 163 INTERMEDIATE READING**

3 unit

Recommended Preparation: ESL 462 and ESL 103

Intermediate college reading skills and strategies with an emphasis on comprehension and functional vocabulary. Total of 54 hours lecture.

Formerly ESL 132.

Grade Mode: Audit, Letter Grade, Pass/No-Pass

#### **ESL 164 HIGH-INTERMEDIATE READING**

3 unit

Recommended Preparation: ESL 004 and 163

Essential college reading skills and strategies with an emphasis on comprehension, academic vocabulary, and reading fluency. Focus on literal and interpretive levels of narrative and expository texts. Formerly

ESL 111. Total of 54 hours lecture.

Grade Mode: Audit, Letter Grade, Pass/No-Pass

#### **ESL 171A EXPLORING TOPICS IN ESL**

3 unit

Exploratory course: Specific topic identified in Schedule of Classes. Lecture focusing on topics of current and general interest. Total of 54 hours lecture

Grade Mode: Audit, Letter Grade, Pass/No-Pass

#### **ESL 171B EXPLORING TOPICS IN ESL**

2 unit

Exploratory course: Specific topic identified in Schedule of Classes. Lecture focusing on topics of current and general interest. Total of 36 hours lecture.

Grade Mode: Audit, Letter Grade, Pass/No-Pass

#### **ESL 171C EXPLORING TOPICS IN ESL**

1 unit

Exploratory course: Specific topic identified in Schedule of Classes. Lecture focusing on topics of current and general interest. Total of 18 hours lecture.

Grade Mode: Audit, Letter Grade, Pass/No-Pass

#### **ESL 172 ESL FOR THE WORKPLACE**

3 unit

Prerequisite(s): Required eligibility for ESL 122 or above

English communication skills appropriate to a workplace setting, including workplace terminology, safety issues, reports and memos, job search skills, communicating with coworkers, and an understanding of workplace ethics. Total of 54 hours lecture.



### ESL 173 INTERMEDIATE SENTENCE STRUCTURE REVIEW 1 unit

Recommended Preparation: Concurrent enrollment in ESL 103 or ESL 004

Review parts of speech and common sentence structures. For ESL students who need a review of common sentences. Formerly ESL 410A. Total of 18 hours lecture.

Grade Mode: Audit, Letter Grade, Pass/No-Pass

#### **ESL 174 VERB REVIEW**

1 unit

Recommended Preparation: Concurrent enrollment in ESL 004 or ESL 005

Review of the English verb system including verb tenses, modals, active/passive, and infinitives/gerunds.For ESL students who need a review of verbs. Formerly ESL 410B. Total of 18 hours lecture.

Grade Mode: Audit, Letter Grade, Pass/No-Pass

### ESL 175 ADVANCED SENTENCE STRUCTURE REVIEW 2 unit

**Recommended Preparation:** ESL 004 Review of advanced grammar structures, including adverb, adjective, and noun clauses, and conditional forms.

For ESL students who need to improve advanced grammar usage. Formerly ESL 133. Total of 36 hours lecture.

Grade Mode: Audit, Letter Grade, Pass/No-Pass

ESL 176 EFFECTIVE SPEAKING AND LISTENING II

### 3 unit

Continuing development of conversation skills in a variety of social situations. Practice and use of intermediate language skills. Listening activities to help students understand natural speech. Vocabulary, idiomatic expressions, and grammatical patterns common to spoken English. Recommended for students who have completed ESL 446 and/or are enrolled in ESL 122 and/or ESL 132. Total of 54 hours lecture.

Grade Mode: Audit, Letter Grade, Pass/No-Pass

# ESL 183 INTERMEDIATE LISTENING AND SPEAKING 3 unit

**Recommended Preparation:** Concurrent enrollment in ESL 103 or successful completion of ESL 482

Support for students at the intermediate level of proficiency to develop their listening and speaking skills in academic and common social contexts. Students will listen to lectures, engage in group discussions, practice pronunciation and make presentations. Total of 54 hours of lecture. Formerly ESL 176.

Grade Mode: Letter Grade, Pass/No-Pass

# ESL 184 HIGH INTERMEDIATE LISTENING AND SPEAKING: AMERICAN CULTURE

3 unit

Recommended Preparation: Concurrent enrollment in ESL 004 or successful completion of ESL 183

Development of high intermediate listening and speaking skills through the discussion of academic and non-academic topics including current events and American cultural and social issues. Activities include oral reports, group and panel discussions, in-class and out-of-class interviews. Some library research and reading assignments. Formerly ESL 136. Total of 54 hours lecture.

Grade Mode: Audit, Letter Grade, Pass/No-Pass

## ESL 246 PRONUNCIATION OF AMERICAN ENGLISH – LEVEL 1 3 unit

Recommended Preparation: ESL 446; or enrollment in ESL 446, or eligibility for ESL 442

Introduction to American speech sounds, basic stress and intonation patterns. Study of selected suffix endings, speech mechanism and phonetic alphabet. No credit if taken after ESL 142. Total of 54 hours

Grade Mode: Audit, Letter Grade, Pass/No-Pass

#### **ESL 402 HIGH-BEGINNING ACADEMIC ENGLISH**

5 unit

**Recommended Preparation:** Placement based on multiple measures

High-beginning level writing, grammar, and reading skills for academic purposes. written practice in sentence structure and paragraphs, readings of short articles, essays, and fictional works. Total of 90 hours leading.

Grade Mode: Audit, Letter Grade, Pass/No-Pass

#### **ESL 403 ESL SKILLS WORKSHOP**

1 unit

Individualized instruction in writing vocabulary, and spelling to assist nonnative speakers of English concurrently enrolled in a core ESL course.

Total of 18 hours lecture.

**Grade Mode:** Audit, Letter Grade, Pass/No-Pass

#### **ESL 410A SENTENCE STRUCTURE REVIEW**

1 unit

Review parts of speech and basic sentence structure. Recommended for students who need review of beginning level grammar. Total of 18 hours

Grade Mode: Letter Grade, Pass/No-Pass

#### **ESL 410B VERB REVIEW**

1 unit

Review of the English verb system including verb tenses, modals, active/passive, and infinitives and gerunds. Recommended for ESL students who need review of verbs. Total of 18 hours lecture.

Grade Mode: Letter Grade



#### **ESL 413 ESL VOCABULARY DEVELOPMENT**

#### 1 unit

Word families, idioms, prefixes and suffixes, dictionary use. Recommended for ESL students who need basic vocabulary development. Total of 18 hours lecture.

Grade Mode: Audit, Letter Grade, Pass/No-Pass

#### **ESL 420 GRAMMAR AND WRITING - LEVEL 1**

#### 4 unit

Intensive practice in basic English sentence structure for students who wish to prepare for college-level work. Introduction to spelling, punctuation, vocabulary development and English writing conventions. Recommended enrollment in ESL 460 and ESL 456. No credit if taken after ESL 033A, 033B, 122, 422, ENGL 001A, 001B, 001C, 100 or 400. Cannot enroll concurrently in ESL 033A, 033B, 122, 422, ENGL 001A, 001B, 001C, 100, or 400. Total of 90 hours lecture and 18 hours laboratory.

Grade Mode: Audit, Letter Grade, Pass/No-Pass

#### **ESL 422 GRAMMAR AND WRITING - LEVEL 2**

4 unit

Prerequisite(s): ESL 420 or satisfactory ESL placement assessment

Development of reading and writing skills for academic purposes. Readings in short essays and fiction; written practice in sentence patterns, paragraphs. Recommended enrollment in ESL 432. No credit if taken after ESL 033A, 033B, 122, ENGL 001A, 001B, 001C, or 100. Cannot enroll concurrently in ESL 033A, 033B, 122, 420, ENGL 001A, 001B, 001C, 100, or 400. Total of 90 hours lecture.

Grade Mode: Audit, Letter Grade, Pass/No-Pass

#### **ESL 431 BEGINNING VOCABULARY**

#### 1 unit

Academic vocabulary development of word families, idiomatic expressions, prefixes and suffixes, and definitions. For ESL students who need academic vocabulary development. Total of 18 hours lecture. Formerly ESL 413.

Grade Mode: Audit, Letter Grade, Pass/No-Pass

#### ESL 432 ESL READING - LEVEL 2

3 unit

Prerequisite(s): ESL 460 or satisfactory reading placement assessment

Development of vocabulary and reading strategies used in academic and personal contexts. Recommended enrollment in ESL 422 and 446. No credit if taken after ESL 132, 111, ENGL 415, 130, or 014. Cannot be taken concurrently with ESL 460, 132, 111 ENGL 415, 130 or 014. Total of 54 hours lecture and 18 hours laboratory. This course may be scheduled using the "To Be Arranged" (TBA) scheduling format.

Grade Mode: Audit, Letter Grade, Pass/No-Pass

#### **ESL 441 BEGINNING PRONUNCIATION**

#### 3 unit

Introduction to American speech sounds, basic stress and intonation patterns. Study of selected suffix endings, speech mechanism and phonetic alphabet. Total of 54 hours lecture. Formerly ESL 246.

**Grade Mode:** Audit, Letter Grade, Pass/No-Pass

#### **ESL 446 EFFECTIVE SPEAKING AND LISTENING**

3 unit

Recommended Preparation: ESL 456, 420 or 460; and enrollment in ESL 432, 422. 246 or 122

Practice of casual and formal dialogues in commonplace situations. Everyday language functions and conversation management skills. Listening activities to enhance comprehension of daily topics. Idiomatic expressions and grammatical patterns common to spoken English. Total of 54 hours lecture.

Grade Mode: Audit, Letter Grade, Pass/No-Pass

#### **ESL 456 BASIC LISTENING AND SPEAKING**

#### 3 unit

Introductory course in spoken English to develop basic communication skills for everyday life in the U.S. Listening skills and conversation practice focus on daily topics, academic lectures, extensive vocabulary building, and practice of basic grammatical structures. Total of 54 hours lecture

**Grade Mode:** Audit, Letter Grade, Pass/No-Pass

#### **ESL 459 TECHNOLOGY FOR ESL STUDENT SUCCESS**

#### 1 unit

Development of technical skills for professional and academic communication through the use of technology, such as multimedia and online learning tools. Total of 18 hours lecture.

Grade Mode: Letter Grade, Pass/No-Pass

#### ESL 460 ESL READING - LEVEL 1

#### 3 unit

Introduction to vocabulary and reading strategies used in academic and personal contexts. Recommended enrollment in ESL 420 and 456. No credit if taken after ESL 432, 132, 111, ENGL 415, 130 or 014. Cannot be taken concurrently with ESL 432, 132, 111, ENGL 415, 130 or 014. Total of 54 hours lecture and 18 hours laboratory. Lab may be scheduled using the "To Be Arranged" (TBA) scheduling format.

Grade Mode: Audit, Letter Grade, Pass/No-Pass

#### **ESL 462 HIGH-BEGINNING READING**

3 unit

**Recommended Preparation:** ESL 402

Development of study skills, vocabulary, and reading strategies used in academic and personal contexts. Formerly ESL 432. Total of 54 hours lecture.

Grade Mode: Audit, Letter Grade, Pass/No-Pass

#### **ESL 472 ESL FOR THE WORKPLACE**

#### 3 unit

English communication skills appropriate to a workplace setting, including workplace terminology, instructions and procedures, safety issues, telephone and email skills, and an understanding of workplace ethics. Recommended eligibility for ESL 420 or 422. No credit if taken after ESL 172. Total of 54 hours lecture.



### ESL 482 HIGH-BEGINNING LISTENING AND SPEAKING

3 unit

**Recommended Preparation:** ESL 402

Discussion of topics relating to academic and everyday situations. Listening skills focus on academic lectures, videos, and conversations. Individual and group presentations. Idiomatic expressions and grammatical patterns common to spoken English. Formerly ESL 446. Total of 54 hours lecture.
