Screen-print, monotype, lithograph, intaglio and relief process. Total of 36 hours lecture and 72 hours laboratory.

ART 023B PRINTMAKING – LITHOGRAPHY

3 unit

Basic black and white and color hand lithographic printing from plate and stone. Introduction to direct drawing with dry and liquid materials, transfer, and photo-lithographic techniques. Total of 36 hours lecture and 72 hours laboratory.

ART 023C PRINTMAKING – MONOTYPE

3 unit

Transfer Credit: CSU; UC

Exploration of printing unique images using a variety of painterly and direct drawing techniques on plexiglass and metal plates. Introduction to stencil, viscosity, texture, and transfer methods. Total of 36 hours lecture and 72 hours laboratory.

ART 024 PRINTMAKING – SILK SCREEN

3 unit

Transfer Credit: CSU; UC

Basic fine art screen printing incorporating paper stencils, screen filler, drawing fluid, and photographic emulsion. Introduction to edition and monoprinting techniques with an emphasis on color printing. Total of 36 hours lecture and 72 hours laboratory.

ART 025 BEGINNING SCULPTURE

3 unit

Transfer Credit: CSU; UC

Introduction to materials, methods and techniques with an emphasis on the development of ideas and personal expression. Materials include clay, plaster, cement, wood utilized for both carving and construction, urethanes, mixed media, video and other digital technologies. Total of 36 hours lecture and 72 hours laboratory.

ART 028 FIGURE SCULPTURE**3 unit***Transfer Credit: CSU; UC***Recommended Preparation:** ART 025

Enrollment Limitation: Ability to lift 15 lbs (minimum weight of a mold with pattern inside) and be able to move around the nude model with a modeling stand on wheels

Study and exploration of the basic principles, materials and techniques in dealing with anatomy and expressive contemporary solutions to figure sculpture. Total of 36 hours lecture and 72 hours laboratory.

Grade Mode: Audit, Letter Grade**ART 031A COLOR AND COMPOSITION – TWO DIMENSIONAL DESIGN****3 unit***Transfer Credit: CSU; UC**C-ID: ARTS 100*

Introduction to the concepts, applications, and historical references related to two-dimensional art and composition, including the study of the basic principles and elements of line, shape, texture, value, color and spatial illusion. Development of a visual vocabulary for creative expression through lecture presentations, studio projects, problem solving, and written assignments. Total of 36 hours lecture and 72 hours of laboratory.

Principles, theories, and applications of additive and subtractive color in two dimensions. Topics include major historical and contemporary color systems, cultural usage, and the perception of color. Exploration and application of color theories in the development and application of design elements and principles in two-dimensional compositions. Total of 36 hours lecture and 72 hours laboratory.

Introduction to the concepts, applications, and historical references related to three-dimensional design and spatial composition, including the study of the elements and organizing principles of design as they apply to three-dimensional space and form. Development of a visual vocabulary for creative expression through lecture presentations and use of appropriate materials for non-representational three-dimensional studio projects. Total of 36 hours lecture and 72 hours laboratory.

Introduction to the product design profession. Emphasis on corporate product and graphic planning; development of student portfolio. Topics can be with Product Design, Entertainment Design or Transportation Design. Total of 36 hours lecture and 72 hours laboratory.

Grade Mode: Audit, Letter Grade**ART 034A APPLIED DESIGN I – MATERIALS AND PROCESSES****3 unit***Transfer Credit: CSU**C-ID: ARTS 280***Recommended Preparation:** ART 032A

Introduction to traditional and contemporary concepts and processes in a variety of design media such as metal, wood/fiber, and glass/plexiglass. Emphasis is on design principles in the development of aesthetic forms based on function. Geared towards students with an interest in Jewelry, Product Design, Interior Design, and Sculpture. Total of 36 hours lecture and 72 hours laboratory.

Intermediate experiences and research in wood, glass, and metal. Exploration of kinetic forms and other fabricated components such as hinges and mechanisms. Total of 36 hours lecture and 72 hours laboratory.

ART 036A JEWELRY/METAL FABRICATION I**3 unit***Transfer Credit: CSU*

Introduction to a wide range of methods, techniques, and material to create jewelry by hand. Includes the study of historical and contemporary practices of jewelry-making and fabrication with a global cultural perspective. Work with copper, brass and sterling silver; creative combination of materials and basic stone setting. Total of 36 hours lecture and 72 hours laboratory.

Grade Mode: *Audit, Letter Grade***ART 036B JEWELRY/METAL FABRICATION II****3 unit***Transfer Credit: CSU***Prerequisite(s):** ART 036A

Expressive use of non-ferrous metal techniques in intermediate fabrication for intermediate jewelry formats. Study of hollow jewelry construction using nonferrous metals. Galvanic etching, hinges, fine silver fusing, and custom made connections will be learned. Total of 36 hours lecture and 72 hours laboratory.

Introduction to ceramic materials, and processes including basic design principles, creative development, hand-building, throwing, glaze techniques, firing and ceramic terminology. The course covers aesthetics and creative development of clay objects examining historical, contemporary, and personal modes of expression across cultures. Total of 36 hours lecture and 72 hours laboratory.

Emphasis placed on application of principles and elements of design in three-dimensional space, ranging from domestic to small commercial projects. Design communication and visualization skills are developed using hand drawings and model building. Total of 36 hours lecture and 72 hours laboratory.

ART 041B INTERIOR DESIGN: SPACE PLANNING AND MATERIALS II

A study of the common techniques and media used in various illustration fields. Emphasis on problem solving by creating illustrations from specific themes. Projects will apply to the areas of print, entertainment, and galleries. Total of 36 hours lecture and 72 hours laboratory.

Projects will serve as portfolio pieces for specific illustration areas. Total of 36 hours lecture and 72 hours laboratory.

ART 070A WORK EXPERIENCE/INTERNSHIP IN ART & DESIGN (PAID)
0.5-8 unit

Transfer Credit: CSU

Prerequisite(s): Completion of one semester at Pasadena City College and completion of one course in major

Enrollment Limitation: Instructor approval

Provides students on-the-job learning in an art and design paid position. Development of effective work habits, attitudes, and career awareness so as to enable students to become productive employees. Credit may be accrued at the rate of 0.5 to 8 units per semester. One unit of credit for each 75 hours of paid work experience.

ART 070B WORK EXPERIENCE/INTERNSHIP IN ART & DESIGN (UNPAID)
0.5-8 unit

Transfer Credit: CSU

Prerequisite(s): Completion of one semester at Pasadena City College and completion of one course in major

Enrollment Limitation: Instructor approval

Provides students on-the-job learning in an unpaid art and design position. Development of effective work habits, attitudes, and career awareness so as to enable students to become productive employees. Credit may be accrued at the rate of 0.5 to 8 units per semester. One unit of credit for each 60 hours of unpaid work experience.

Class meetings may also include field trips or meetings with artists, gallery directors and other art professionals. This course is best suited to students who have already created a body of work that they wish to exhibit. Work in any medium is accepted. Total of 36 hours lecture and 72 hours laboratory.

Prerequisite(s): *ART 018*

Advanced graphic visualization for convincing representation emphasizing advanced presentation techniques and styles by use of marker, pencil, chalk and gouache. Total of 36 hours lecture and 72 hours laboratory.

ART 135 PORTFOLIO DEVELOPMENT OF JEWELRY AND METAL FABRICATION

3 unit

Prerequisite(s): *ART 036C*

Development of an advanced portfolio of metalwork and jewelry utilizing metal fabrication, enameling, and setting techniques. Advanced project techniques such as conceptual and design research and planning, safe studio practices, and execution of jewelry production. Total of 36 hours lecture and 72 hours laboratory.

ART 145 PORTFOLIO DEVELOPMENT AND CRITIQUE

3 unit

Development of individual art practice through production of new original work (in any medium), a written artist's statement, and group discussion of art, texts, professional practices and preparation for transfer. May also include field trips or meetings with visiting art professionals. Students are expected to initiate self-defined projects, to execute them outside of class and to present this work for in-class critique. Previous art-related coursework and demonstrated ability to produce art independently are highly recommended. Total of 36 hours lecture and 72 hours laboratory.
