### PSYC 001 INTRODUCTORY PSYCHOLOGY

3 unit

Transfer Credit: CSU; UC

C-ID: PSY 110

Principles of human behavior; physiological foundations, influence of heredity and environment; sense-perception, attention, capacities and abilities; learning; emotion and motivation; special emphasis on personality development and adjustment. No credit if taken after PSYC 001H. Total of 54 hours lecture.

#### PSYC 002 INTRODUCTORY BIOLOGICAL PSYCHOLOGY 3 unit

Transfer Credit: CSU; UC

Prerequisite(s): PSYC 001

Interrelationship of physiological mechanisms and behavior. Emphasis on the role of the brain and nervous system in perception, emotion, motivation, states of consciousness, language, memory and learning. Relevance of the biological perspective to an understanding of behavior and experience. Total of 54 hours lecture.

#### PSYC 003 ABNORMAL PSYCHOLOGY

3 unit

Transfer Credit: CSU; UC

Prerequisite(s): PSYC 001 or PSYC 001H

The definition, theories, symptoms and treatment of psychological disorders. Review of major classes of mental disorders with a focus on commonly diagnosed disorders. Best practices in mental health treatment and community support systems. Special emphasis on critical thinking, and the impact of bias on marginalized groups. Total of 54 hours

#### PSYC 005 RESEARCH METHODS IN PSYCHOLOGY

4 unit

Transfer Credit: CSU; UC

C-ID: PSY 205B

Prerequisite(s): One of the following: PSYC 001 or 001H and one of the following: ENGL 001A or 001AH; and one of the following: STAT 015, 018, 050,

Planning and execution of research in psychology, and analysis, interpretation and reporting of data. Total of 54 hours lecture and 54 hours laboratory.

#### **PSYC 020 INDEPENDENT STUDY**

1 unit

#### PSYC 021H HONORS DEVELOPMENTAL PSYCHOLOGY: THE CHILD 3 unit

Transfer Credit: CSU; UC

#### PSYC 022 DEVELOPMENTAL PSYCHOLOGY: THE ADULT 3 unit

Dynamics of psychological development from young adulthood through maturity and old age; sensory, motor, neurological, and cognitive changes; development of personality and social behavior through the adult life cycle; process of aging, dying, and bereavement. Total of 54 hours lecture.

#### **PSYC 023 SOCIAL PSYCHOLOGY**

3 unit

Transfer Credit: CSU; UC

C-ID: PSY 170

The individual within a social context; the scientific study of how people think about, influence and relate to one another. Topics include: attitude development and change; conformity, persuasion, leadership; and interpersonal relations, prejudice, aggression, conflict resolution, liking and loving others. Total of 54 hours lecture.

#### PSYC 024 LIFESPAN DEVELOPMENTAL PSYCHOLOGY 3 unit

Transfer Credit: CSU; UC credit limitations. See counselor. C-ID: PSY 180

Process and dynamics of human development from conception through adult maturity, old age, and death; biological, cognitive, personality, sociocultural, and existential factors influencing the course of psychological development across the lifespan. Total of 54 hours lecture.

Grade Mode: Audit, Letter Grade

#### **PSYC 025 HUMAN SEXUALITY**

3 unit

Transfer Credit: CSU; UC C-ID: PSY 130

Historical, psychological, sociological and biological aspects of love, intimacy and human sexuality. Total of 54 hours lecture.

Grade Mode: Audit, Letter Grade, Pass/No-Pass

#### **PSYC 062 AFRICAN AMERICAN PSYCHOLOGY**

Transfer Credit: CSU; UC

African American behavior patterns in relationship to dominant concepts in psychology. Analysis of psychological attitudes and issues of African Americans resulting from racism, oppression and alienation. Emphasis placed on the intersectionalities of race, ethnicity, gender, class, sexuality, etc. No credit if taken after ETH 062 or PSYC 029. Total of 54 hours lecture. Formerly PSYC 029.

## PSYC 072 PSYCHOLOGY OF THE ASIAN AMERICAN

3 unit

Transfer Credit: CSU; UC

Asian American behavior patterns in relationship to basic principles of psychology; search for identity in a multicultural society; roles of male and female in Asian American society. No credit if taken after PSYC 041 or ETH 072. Total of 54 hours lecture. Formerly PSYC 041.

Grade Mode: Audit, Letter Grade, Pass/No-Pass

#### PSYC 082 CHICANO/A PSYCHOLOGY

3 unit

Transfer Credit: CSU; UC

Analysis of the psychology of Mexican Americans and Chicano/a as compared to mainstream society and other marginalized communities. Focus on issues such as racism, family, identity, relationships, religion/ spirituality, mental and physical health, cultural expressions, and civic engagement. Emphasis placed on the intersectionalities of race, immigration status, ethnicity, gender, class, sexuality, etc. No credit if taken after ETH 082 or PSYC 031. Total of 54 hours lecture. Formerly
